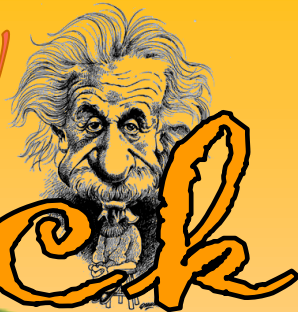

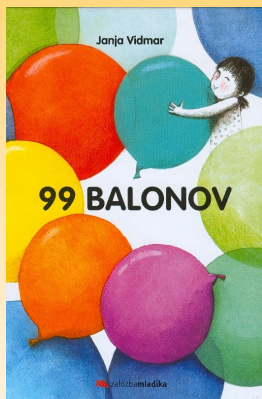

Albert Einstein

FAMOUS PEOPLE

I chose Albert Einstein because he was and still is the father of the modern and because he was a genius and he got the Nobel prize in physics.

Einstein was the son of Jewish immigrants. His father was a salesman, his name was Hermann Einstein. Einstein's mother was Paulina Einstein, her maiden name was Koch. His parents married in Stuttgart. Einstein's birth house was near a train station. The entire neighborhood was destroyed at the end of the 20th century. There's a monument on the place where the house was.

In the year 1884 his family moved to Zending. In 1889 he started to visit the gymnasium in Munich. In high school he wasn't bad, but he was obstinate because he learned only the things that have interested him.

He was really good at Maths, Latin and Science. He had problems with modern foreign languages.

In 1894 the family moved to Pavia in Milan. Einstein remained in Munich to finish the final year of high school and to graduate.

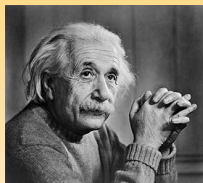
He felt very lonely. From loneliness he quit school and then he went home to his parents.

On the Swiss National Technical High School (ETH) in Zurich in 1895, he performed an admission test.

They advised him to finish the final year of high school.

He obtained his high school canton.

Swiss schools were significantly less rigid than the German schools and Swiss schools are focused on the student's specialities.



Albert Einstein

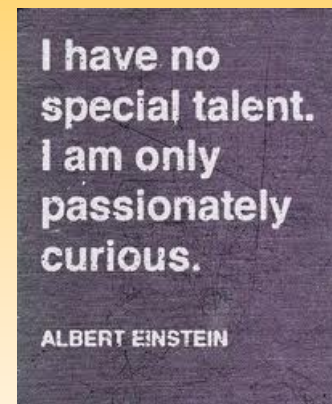
Without doing the exam, he entered the teaching direction of ETH Polytechnic, where he began to study mathematics and physics.

In 1898 he met a Serbian classmate and a friend of Nikola Tesla, Mileva Maric. For teachers, Einstein was an average student and many of the teachers didn't like him because he learnt only the things that interested him. In 1900 he graduated, a year later he received the Swiss citizenship.

In a bank in Switzerland, a detective found 500 previously unknown letters from Einstein.

The letters revealed that he had a daughter with Mileva Marić in January 1902. The daughter's name was Liesl.

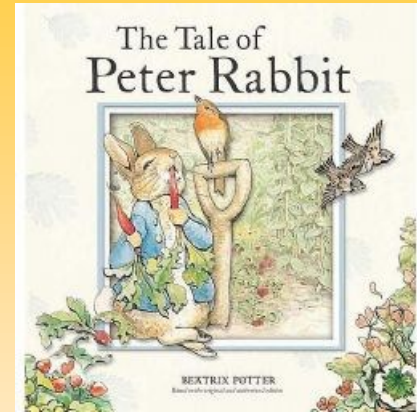
Benjamin's dad went to Peter's mum. They

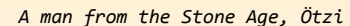

Dear Tilen,

I've heard that you're eating fast food and you all ready know that it's unhealthy, but you don't mind that. Probably you've learned that fast food is very unhealthy because it contains fats, salt and similar things, but maybe you didn't know that fast food can make you very ill. If you eat too much unhealthy food you'll become fat and you're heart won't work properly and as the result of that you can get a heart attack and you can die. Many people that are fat and eat unhealthy food live in average 10 years less, than people that do sport and eat healthy food.

Even though you're not ill yet, you can get ill in 5 years if you don't change your diet. For example, instead of eating fast food you can eat more healthy food like vegetables, fruit; I know that you can't change your diet in 1 day because you are used to this diet now, but if you eat more vegetables and fruit every day you'll be able to change your diet in a few months. Still your diet should contain proteins, a bit of fat and carbohydrates and last but not least vitamins and minerals. A PINCH OF EVERYTHING

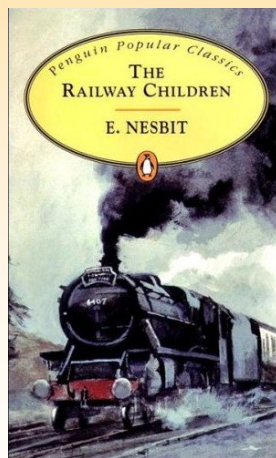
English Competition is a competition where students of 9th class from whole Slovenia compete in the knowledge and understanding of English.

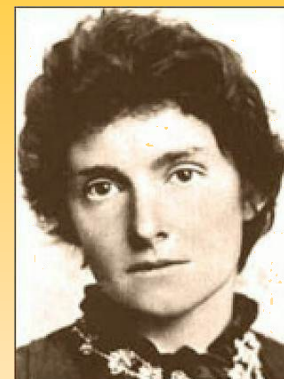
I really worked hard, but nothing would happen without my mentor Aleksandra

American Pancakes

E Ingredients:

I (What do we need?)

- four pots of flour
- two eggs
- four pots of milk
- baking powder
- four small spoons of sugar
- one small spoon of salt
- oil.

U Instructions:

(How to do it?)

We need two bowls. In one bowl we put flour, then add salt and baking powder*, we mix that. Then we need one more bowl to separate* yolks* and egg whites*. We crack two eggs. We mix egg whites into snow. In the bowl with yolks we add sugar and milk. We can mix that with a spoon or with a mixing machine. Stir it for about 5 minutes till everything is smooth. Add the mixture with the flour, salt and baking powder. Stir it again, but a little bit longer. At the end add the egg whites (the snow) and mix everything together. Now we need a pan. We heat some oil in the pan, then we pour a bit of the mixture into the pan in the circle. American pancakes

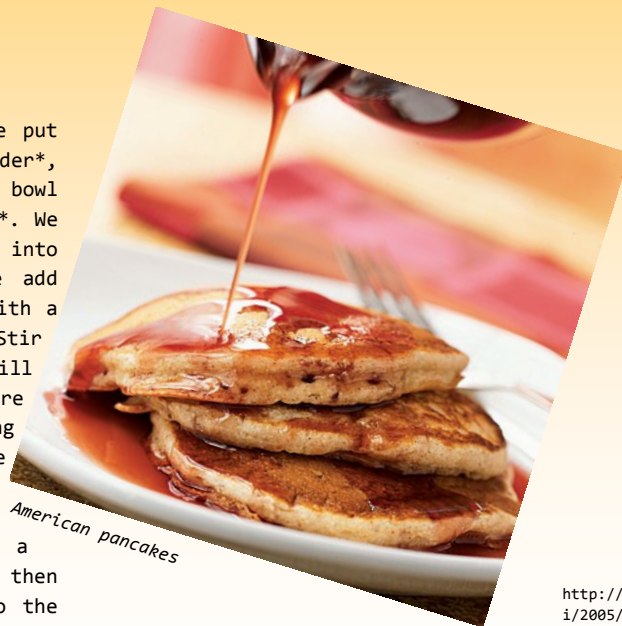
must be a little bit thicker than normal European ones. We fry them until some bubbles are shown. We continue with frying the pancakes. We can cover them with strawberries, berry or chocolate syrup. While eating American pancakes you can drink juice.

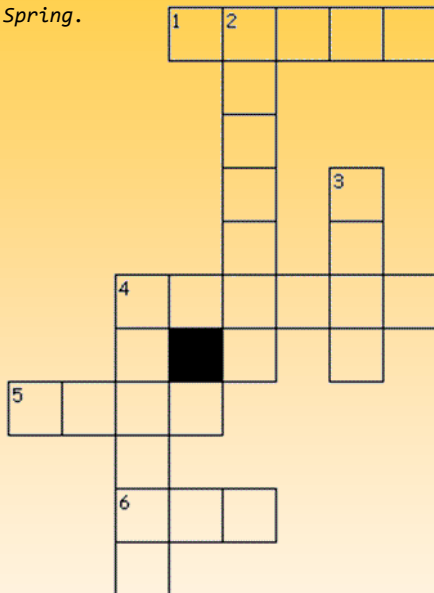

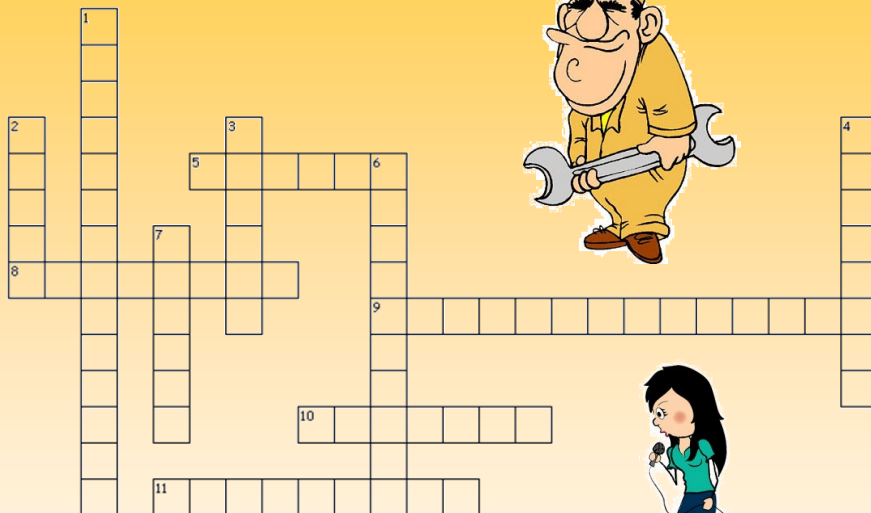
